GENERAL DISCUSSION

INTRODUCTION & PROJECT OVERVIEW

- Plan is a framework for future development and street improvements
 - Helps to identify infrastructure investments that improve the bike/ped network
 - With a focus on connections to destinations and transit stops
- Study builds upon past efforts and identifies challenges and barriers to walking/biking/moving around safely and comfortably
- Part of the study includes a safety analysis to help the City apply for grants
- We are maximizing community input through an online public survey that closed in December and a series of public workshops
- Vision Statement
 - Change bicycling to cycling
 - Consider revising "historic"
- Adding a fourth Steering Committee meeting
- Report will have five sections: introduction, existing conditions, community voices, strategies, and actions for implementation

DESIGN GUIDANCE

- Using NACTO and other state and national resources to develop guidance
- Developing guidance on preferred improvements for three street types and three different areas, so there will be nine categories of design guidance. Street types include:
 - Arterial
 - o Collector
 - Local

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- Three areas of Pensacola based on street layout and age of development:
 - Urban Center: downtown
 - o Urban General: Pre-mid-20th century
 - o Suburban: Post-mid-20th century
- Design guidance will provide tools to assess streets for preferred treatments
- Plan will include three renderings to show conceptual options
- Clarification needed on specific outcomes. There will not be a specific list of every improvement
 needed on every road. There will be the future network map with bicycle facility
 recommendations, a sidewalk gap analysis map, as well as the design guidance for preferred
 treatments based on the roadway characteristics and land use. Plan will include three
 renderings to show conceptual options for different types of roads and their context
 classification. CRA district meetings can be a great place to discuss the design guidance and
 future network map recommendations for specific roads.
- Avoid holidays when scheduling public workshops
- Guidance includes flexibility and decision making process to identify options when there are constraints on a facility
- Consider a category between arterial and collector

- Main buckets of improvements:
 - Intersection/crossing improvement
 - Trail/protected cycling lane
